Introduction: Corruption in High Places



1. Eli's sons were wicked

a) The reason: they did not know the Lord (v12)

b) They were greedy (v13-17)

c) They were immoral (v22)

2. The contrast with Samuel (v18-21, 26)

a) He ministered before the LORD (v18)

b) He grew (v21, 26)

c) A glimpse of faithfulness

3. Judgement coming on the wicked household

a) Eli's words were not enough (v25, 27-29)

b) They failed in their responsibility (v30)

c) Therefore, judgement is coming (v31-34)
